The company manages the full supply chain — from responsible tapping and harvest to meticulous hand-sorting, compliance management, professional packaging, and direct international export.

Unlike conventional commodity traders who aggregate resin from multiple anonymous sources, Boswellia Botanics is directly involved at every stage of the value chain. We manage the trees, work with our harvester communities, and personally oversee every batch from the point of tapping to the point of export. This is what it means to be a grower-led exporter.

Our Commitments to Sustainability

Sustainability is not a marketing statement for Boswellia Botanics — it is an operational mandate woven into every aspect of what we do. The frankincense tree (Boswellia) is a slow-growing, long-lived species that requires decades of growth before it can be responsibly tapped. Overharvesting, improper tapping, and habitat degradation have placed Boswellia trees under significant pressure across the Horn of Africa.

Our response to this challenge is both principled and practical:

- We only tap trees that are between 15 and 40 years old and have a diameter at breast height (DBH) greater than 10 centimetres.
- We enforce strict resting periods between tapping cycles to allow trees to regenerate their resin reserves.
- We collaborate with local harvesters to train them in sustainable tapping techniques that maximize yield without damaging the tree.
- We use eco-friendly packaging materials that reduce environmental impact across our logistics chain.
- We invest a portion of revenues back into community programs that support the livelihoods of frankincense communities.



04 OUR STORY

From Tree to Market — A Journey Rooted in Tradition



Frankincense has flowed from the Horn of Africa to the rest of the world for over 5,000 years. It was traded along the ancient Incense Route to Egypt, Rome, Greece, and the courts of the Arabian Peninsula. Today, the same resin that once perfumed the temples of antiquity is found in luxury perfumery, cosmetic formulations, aromatherapy blends, and anti-inflammatory medicine across every continent.

Somaliland sits at the epicentre of this ancient trade. The region's arid highlands and unique ecology produce some of the world's most prized frankincense species — particularly *Boswellia Frereana* (Maydi), which is found almost exclusively in Somaliland and is coveted by the global fragrance and wellness industries.

Our Origin

Boswellia Botanics was built by individuals who grew up in and around the frankincense trade. For years, we supplied larger exporters and regional intermediaries. When we recognised that the world was seeking greater supply chain



transparency, and that direct relationships between producers and buyers would define the future of ethical commodity trade, we made the decision to export directly.

The Harvest Process

The journey of frankincense from tree to market is a labour-intensive, skilled process that spans months and requires both traditional knowledge and careful quality management. Our harvest process follows these defined stages:

1. Tree Selection & Assessment

Our team assesses each tree for age, health, and DBH before any tapping commences. Only mature, healthy trees above 10cm DBH are approved for harvest. Trees showing signs of stress or disease are placed in recovery and are not tapped until they recover fully.

2. Tapping

Skilled harvesters make precise, shallow incisions into the bark of the tree — a process known as tapping. The depth, width, and number of incisions are carefully controlled to avoid damaging the tree's vascular tissue. Resin (oleogum resin) is secreted by the tree in response to the incision and is left to harden in the open air for several weeks.

3. Collection

Hardened resin tears are carefully hand-collected and placed into clean collection bags. The collection process prioritises minimising bark inclusion and contamination. Timing of collection is managed to ensure optimal hardening and aroma profile development.

4. Sorting & Grading

Collected resin is transported to our sorting facilities where our skilled team meticulously grades each batch by size, colour, purity, moisture content, and botanical grade. This



sorting process determines the commercial grade of each batch and ensures that all products meet our quality specifications before packaging.

5. Quality Inspection & Testing

Each graded batch undergoes quality inspection, including organoleptic assessment (colour, aroma, texture) and, where required, laboratory testing. We maintain rigorous quality control records for every consignment.

6. Packaging & Compliance

Approved batches are packaged using appropriate food-grade or export-grade materials. All necessary export documentation — including certificates of origin, phytosanitary certificates, and compliance declarations — are prepared by our experienced team.

7. Export & Delivery

Our logistics team manages international shipping, customs clearance, and delivery coordination to ensure that every consignment reaches our buyers on schedule and in perfect condition.

A. Boswellia Frereana — Maydi Frankincense

Boswellia Frereana, known locally as Maydi, is the crown jewel of the frankincense world. Found almost exclusively in the highlands of Somaliland and northern Somalia, Maydi is distinguished by its remarkably clean, citrus-tinged resinous aroma and its uniquely low boswellic acid content — making it a preferred choice in luxury perfumery and aromatherapy.

Maydi tears are large, pale yellow to amber, and have a distinctive milky-white coating that forms as the resin hardens in the open air. The resin burns cleanly with a rich, uplifting fragrance that has been used for centuries in sacred and ceremonial contexts across the Islamic world and East Africa.



B. Boswellia Carterii — Moxor Frankincense

Boswellia Carterii, known as Moxor, is the most widely recognized frankincense species in global trade. With a warm, balsamic, slightly sweet fragrance and a rich Boswellia acid profile, *Carterii* is prized by the pharmaceutical, wellness, aromatherapy, and cosmetic industries. It is widely researched for its anti-inflammatory and therapeutic properties.

Carterii resin tears range from yellow-amber to brown, depending on grade. Our *Carterii* is harvested from mature trees in prime growing zones within Somaliland, ensuring a consistently high boswellic acid content and rich aromatic profile that meets pharmaceutical and cosmetic grade requirements.



C. Boswellia Occulta

Boswellia Occulta, sometimes referred to locally as Moxor Madow ("dark moxor"), is a distinctive and relatively rare species within our portfolio. It possesses unique physical characteristics that differentiate it clearly from standard Boswellia Carterii.

The resin is characteristically darker in hue and presents as a mixed-grade product featuring variegated white resin tears interspersed with darker pieces and small fragments of natural bark. This natural profile gives Boswellia Occulta a unique aroma and resin chemistry that is gaining interest among specialists in incense crafting, niche perfumery, and natural product formulation.



Competitive Advantage

Boswellia Occulta is competitively priced at USD 7 per kg, making it an attractive option for buyers seeking unique, lower-cost frankincense varieties with distinctive aromatic profiles. Availability is subject to seasonal harvest cycles.

D. Myrrh — Cimmiphora Molmol (Malmal)

Myrrh (Commiphora species, locally known as Malmal) has been traded from the Horn of Africa for millennia. Used in ancient Egyptian embalming, traditional medicine across Asia and the Middle East, and modern pharmaceutical and cosmetic applications, myrrh is one of the world's oldest and most versatile botanical commodities.

Boswellia Botanics sources its myrrh from ethically managed Commiphora trees in Somaliland's drylands. Our myrrh resin is available in premium grades characterized by large, clean tears with a warm, earthy, medicinal aroma and high resin content. Primary



applications include traditional medicine, essential oil extraction, oral health products, skin care, and incense manufacturing.

Gum Arabic (Acacia Senegal) is a natural gum sourced from the sap of Acacia trees. It is one of the world's most widely used food and industrial additives, approved by the FDA, EFSA, and other regulatory bodies as a food-grade emulsifier, stabiliser, and binding

agent. Demand for high-quality Gum Arabic continues to grow across food and beverage, pharmaceutical, printing, and adhesives industries.

Our Gum Arabic is ethically sourced with assured quality standards, making it suitable for food-grade, pharmaceutical, and industrial applications. It is available in Grade 1 (High Quality) at USD 7 per kg, in bulk quantities suitable for container-level export.

06 COMPLIANCE & QUALITY ASSURANCE

Meeting the Highest International Standards

Quality assurance at Boswellia Botanics is not a final-stage checkpoint — it is a philosophy embedded at every stage of our operations, from the selection of harvest trees through to the final inspection of packaged export consignments.

Our Quality Framework

1. Sourcing Standards

We collaborate directly with local harvesters in Somaliland whose practices we know and oversee. Every sourcing partner adheres to our Ethical Harvesting Charter, which defines the minimum standards for tree selection, tapping technique, collection hygiene, and environmental compliance.

2. Harvesting Controls

Our harvesting team enforces strict biological controls on tapping. Key parameters include minimum tree age (15–40 years), minimum trunk diameter (>10cm DBH), maximum number of tapping incisions per season, and mandatory inter-season recovery periods. These controls are monitored by our field supervisors and documented in our harvest records.

3. Sorting & Grading

All harvested resin is transported to our sorting facility where it is inspected, cleaned, and classified by our trained grading team. Products are assessed against our grade specifications across four key criteria: tear size, colour and clarity, moisture content, and botanical purity.

4. Documentation & Certifications

Boswellia Botanics manages the full suite of export compliance documentation, including:

- Certificate of Origin
- Phytosanitary Certificate
- Commercial Invoice and Packing List
- Bill of Lading / Airway Bill
- Quality Inspection Certificate
- CITES documentation (where applicable for regulated species)

Regulatory Commitment

We adhere to all local and international regulations governing the production and export of natural botanical products. This includes environmental regulations, fair trade principles, and international quality standards. Our compliance team stays abreast of changing regulations across target markets and proactively updates our documentation and processes accordingly.

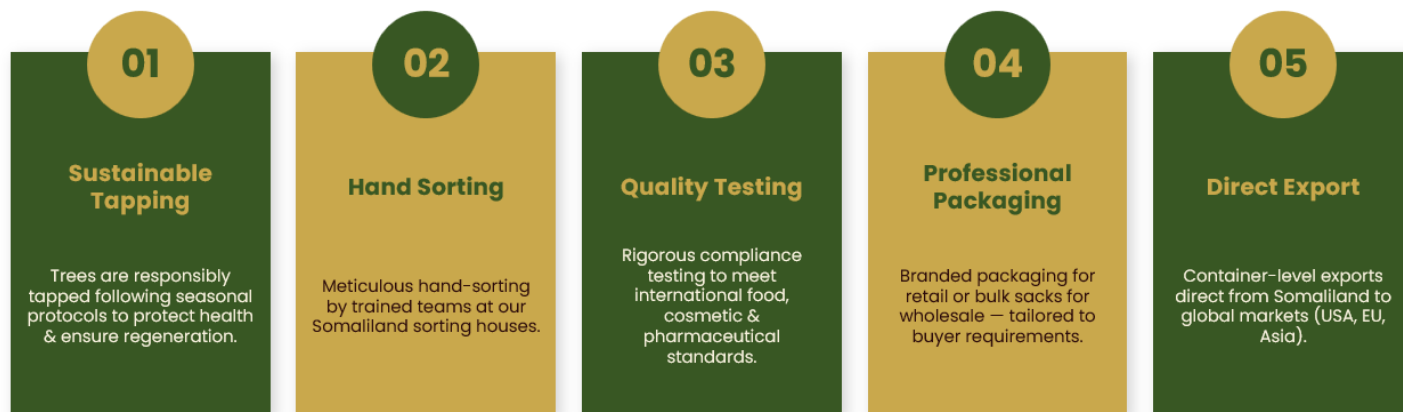

Sustainable Harvesting

We work closely with local harvesters to implement sustainable harvesting techniques that protect frankincense trees and their ecosystems. Harvest planning is conducted annually, with harvest rights managed through our community partnerships.

Traceability

Our supply chain is fully traceable from the point of harvest to the final packaged product, ensuring transparency and accountability. Each batch carries documentation linking it to the specific harvest location, date, and harvester.



Sorting & Grading Facility

Our dedicated sorting facility in Somaliland enables us to process, grade, and inspect all products before export. This in-house capability ensures that grading decisions are made under our direct supervision.

Supplier Relationships

We build strong, long-term relationships with our harvesting communities, providing them with training, equipment, and fair price guarantees. These relationships ensure supply stability and quality consistency season after season.

Customised Packaging

We provide customised packaging solutions that protect the integrity of frankincense and gums and cater to various market needs. Our eco-friendly packaging options – including jute bags, natural fibre sacks, and food-grade sealed packaging – align with our sustainability goals and buyer requirements.

Rigorous quality control is applied at harvesting, collection, sorting, packaging, and pre-shipment inspection. Our quality records accompany each consignment as part of our standard documentation package.

At Boswellia Botanics, sustainability is our most fundamental commitment — not because it is good marketing, but because without healthy trees and thriving harvesting communities, there is no business.

Environmental Stewardship

Our environmental commitments include:

- Strict tapping protocols that prevent over-tapping and allow tree recovery.
- Age-based and size-based selection criteria ensuring only mature trees are harvested.
- Prohibition on burning, land clearing, or any activity that damages frankincense tree habitat.
- Active monitoring of tree health and population density across our sourcing areas.
- Eco-friendly packaging that reduces plastic waste and environmental impact.
